Disability

- Treat our children as individuals.
- Provide a bespoke curriculum to fit individuals needs.
- Educate our parents on their child's disability.
- Adapt our classrooms for individuals needs.
- Liaise with therapists to support our children.
- Integrate our children into the local community.



- Avoid blanket terms.
- Avoid terms that imply normalcy/ health when referring to people without disability.
- Use positive language rather than emphasizing limitations.
- Avoid outdated or derogatory terms.



- Support all family members.
- Celebrate age through birthdays.
- Encourage training for all staff, whatever age.
- Adapt practices for relevant members of staff.
- Provide flexible working for staff.
- Encourage our children to care for
  wider community through educational
  trips to care homes.



- Avoid general terms that imply people of a certain age are all the same.
- Avoid using the terms 'boys', 'girls' when talking to colleagues, as these refer to young children.
- Avoid using language that stereotypes or implies a particular age group is more or less able.

# Gender reassignment

- Support with social stories.
- Offer family support through open communication channels.
- Encourage understanding of gender through thought provoking texts.
- Have unisex toilets.
- Have flexible uniform choices.
- Encourage 'typical' gender role reversal play.
- Ask what pronouns a person my be wanted to be identified with.

# Gender reassignment

- Use gender neutral terms.
- Use gender neutral pronouns and expressions and respect peoples preferences.
- Use terms that include all relationships.
- Avoid job titles that imply gender.
- Avoid using patronising terms that may cause offence.
- Avoid irrelevant gender descriptions.
- Recognise and respect the difference between sexual orientation and gender identity.

## Marriage and civil partnership

- Encourage understanding through role
  play and small world toys.
- Encourage understanding of marriage and civil partnership through thought provoking texts.
- Educate our children about different types of families through our PSHE curriculum.
- Work with families to support with any changes in circumstances.
  - Share information with both parents.

## Marriage and civil partnership



- Avoid suggesting that certain relationship status are superior to others.
- Avoid suggesting that relationship status impacts career or opportunities.
- Respect diversity in families.

## Pregnancy and Maternity

- Use our PCRE curriculum to support our children to understand reproduction and how to care for others.
- Support our parents to access our PCRE curriculum through parental workshops.
- Provide social stories for children expecting new siblings.
- Have flexible working roles for staff.
- Risk assess appropriately to support each other.

- Avoid making assumptions about a person's role in the family.
- Promote and support choices around feeding.
